Stop the sale; prevent the addiction.

Guam has one of the highest youth smoking rates in the Region. In 2005, 1 out of 3 high school students and 1 out of 6 middle school students reported smoking cigarettes in the past 30 days.*

Tobacco kills. About half of all deaths on Guam are tobacco-related.

Reducing access to cigarettes is one element of a comprehensive approach to help prevent tobacco use among Guam's children.

> Tobacco: ILLEGAL under 18; LETHAL at any age.

According to Guam Public Law 24-278 (Tobacco Control Act of 1998), it is against the law to sell tobacco products to persons under the age of 18.

Penalties are stiff:

- 1. **1**st **Violation \$500.00** (in any 5-year period)
- 2nd Violation \$1,000, AND Vendor's license suspended for 90 days
- 3rd Violation -\$2,500, AND Vendor's license suspended for 180 days
- 4 or more Violations \$5,000 (in any 5-year period), AND license revoked; Vendor ineligible to apply for a license for 2 years

Tips to avoid breaking the law

- Do not sell tobacco products to anyone below 18 years of age.
- Do not guess someone's age. Request for identification from anyone you believe to be under the age of 27.
- 3. Ask for a valid photo ID before retrieving tobacco products and before you ring up the sale.
- 4. Preferably, keep tobacco products behind the counter to prevent easy access by minors.
